



Dear Parent and/or Guardian,

Disability Rights Maine (DRM) is Maine's federally mandated protection and advocacy agency. DRM is a non-profit organization, independent of state and federal government. Some of the services DRM provides are:

- Information about rights and service systems
- Referrals to appropriate services
- Representation of individuals at meetings and hearings
- Legal representation of individuals or groups
- Training on rights and advocacy skills
- Working towards broad systems change.

Federal and state law permit DRM to provide outreach and monitor residential facilities for the purpose of ensuring that services, supports, and assistance meet the needs of residents and are delivered in conformity with laws, regulations, rules and other standards regarding quality of care. Monitoring may include talking with residents, including minors and individuals under guardianship.

This letter is to provide you with information about our services and notification that a DRM advocate may talk with your child during an upcoming visit at Millcreek in Arkansas.

During the monitoring visit, in addition to observing the conditions and services, DRM may provide information about rights and service systems, referrals to appropriate services, and training on rights and advocacy skills. Our visit will be conducted in a manner that minimizes our interference with Millcreek's programs and treatment, respects residents' privacy interests, and honors a resident's request to not participate.
