Realizing The Relevance

2013-2017 Statistics where physical disability/mobility was a factor:


- 410 fatal home fire deaths
- 420 non-fatal home fire injuries
- One-third (33%) of fatalities resulted from fires ignited by smoking materials
- 85% of fatalities resulted from fires in one or two-family homes

Realizing The Relevance (Continued)

- One-third (32%) of fatalities resulted from bedroom fires
- More than one-quarter (28%) of deaths were caused by living room fires
- 12% of deaths resulted from kitchen fires
- 12% of deaths involved medical oxygen
- 42% of individuals were in the area of origin and involved with ignition


Structure Fires in Health Care Properties, by Occupancy Type, 2011-2015 Annual Averages



During this five-year period, U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated average of 5,750 structure fires in health care facilities per year.






- A grassroots initiative that emerged in smoke and fire to provide the most vulnerable in our communities with the simplest recommended tool: respirator masks.

 - Protocols and procedures are largely determined locally
 - Fire fighters are <u>not</u> required to report individual cases of abuse/neglect to their state P&A

- Disability representation on Code Councils/enforcement boards

- Locked door/seclusion rooms in schools
- Facility emergency/evacuation plans and exercises
- Educational outreach for students and adults with disabilities
- Integrate consistent disability inclusive fire safety into training programs for fire fighters of all rank
- Build relationships that support Rapid responses
- Revise community risk reduction plans
